IV. JCR Committee Reports:

1. (LGBTQ+ rep and Trans Rep (JA and EF)) College's definition of transphobia.

At the final JCR meeting last year, the JCR resolved to adopt the new SU definition of transphobia. After discussion with College Student Management, this will not be adopted by College. It has been adopted by other colleges e.g. Merton.

The Trans reps and LGBTQ+ reps will meet with College to discuss this again, after the new College harassment policy has been released.

- (JG) Should the JCR want the lower cap to become part of the Constitution, another motion would need to be put forward.

- (BP) the management of the sports budget has changed this year, so each captain liaises with the Sports Reps to claim what they need so there is limited flexibility in the budget.

7. Motion Title: Pay for match kit for St Hilda's College Netball Club

Questions raised:

- (RF) Do other teams have to pay for their own kit? Yes, some of it, but also have team kit owned by the JCR (e.g. Football and Rugby)
- (EB) Could the team make use of the College reimbursement of kit? Yes, but it can be used repeatedly if owned by College.
- (RF) What sizes will be bought? A variety, primarily middle sizes and up.
- (JG) Will only providing dresses limit inclusivity and engagement? People of all sexes wear netball dresses at other Colleges. Team members can wear shorts with the dress.

The meeting noted that:

- (ES) If members of the team wish to buy their own kit, this could bring the price down through offers based on quantity of purchases.
 - (ES) This is the cheapest cost after having done extensive research.
 - (ES) The company claims to be environmentally friendly, uses sustainable materials and is all female led.

8. Motion title: Support for St Hilda's College Rugby Club (Men's and Women's teams)

NB: As the Chair (VP) proposed and spoke for an amendment, the President took over as Chair during this motion to ensure impartiality.

Amendments:

- (RB) **Remove** the resolution to "Donate £160.00 from the motions budget to subsidise the cost of transport to Twickenham Stadium. A 22-seat minibus has been booked by the club at a total cost of £480.00 return." From the motion.
(passed with opposition. Votes for: 38. Votes against: 10.)

Questions raised:

- (AB) Is it the JCR's responsibility to pay for a Club social event? The motion budget is not just for necessities but for things/events that benefit JCR members.
- (ES) Why did the Rugby Club not motion for money before the event was booked? The event needed to be planned before the start of term.
- (EB) Why are you getting a minibus as opposed to public transport? Overall, it is cheaper as it will take the team directly to Twickenham Stadium.

The meeting noted that:

- (GF) The kit was bought in advance of asking for reimbursement as the team needed it to train for Cuppers matches.
 - (HG) Rugby Club members had already significantly contributed towards the Twickenham event.
 - (JB) If there are genuine hardship difficulties, JCR members can apply to the College Hardship Fund.
