### ***Motion One***

It Happens Here Campaign

- Kaelyn Jones proposes that this JCR supports 'It Happens Here', Oxford's anti-sexual violence campaign.
- The SU previously supported the campaign, but the student campaign disbanded, meaning that IHH are now operating independently. The group is applying for a society grant, but this may take some time. Financial support would greatly benefit IHH in its early stages, including its termly 'Still I Write' event.
- To help fund the society, combat the prevalence of sexual violence in Oxford, and provide a safe space for survivors, this JCR proposes to allocate £150 towards 'It Happens Here'.

### ***Motion Three***

Turl Magazine funding

- Kaelyn Jones and Esther Kim propose that this JCR supports The Turl Magazine.
- A recently revived student arts magazine with contributors from all colleges, Kaelyn and Esther are members of the events and design teams respectively. The magazine is an inclusive space for students to get involved in student journalism, helping to build a creative and inclusive space for students.

- InDesign, a crucial piece of software to lay in the magazine, is becoming increasingly expensive. To help mitigate the rising costs of InDesign, printing, and events, this JCR proposes to allocate £100 to fund The Turl.
